

Welcome to the SpringTerm in Year 6
This term we will be learning all about:

English

This term we will be reading a variety of different writing genres, both fiction and non-fiction and using our developing skills to compose our own writing based on these styles. We will also be improving comprehension skills through regular comprehension exercises as we lead up to the SATs at the start of next term.

Mathematics

As well as revisiting the topics from last term we will also have an introduction to basic algebra, complete work on statistics and explore ratio and proportion. All of these topics will be completed by practising and then applying skills learned in problem solving contexts.

Science

Our topic this term is Classifying Living Things, which includes understanding the Classification System for living things and being able to use keys to identify unknown plants and animals. We will also be conducting an investigation into how micro-organisms develop in different conditions.

Computing

We will be using LOGO to develop our programming skills. We will also be continuing to plan our end of year project entitled 'Memories'. As well as this we will be completing activities to help develop our Online Safety skills.

Ours Maths homework this term continues to be developing times tables quick recall skills and to be able to identify the related division facts in order to improve calculation skills. As a class, we are already very good at the times tables and are now working on becoming even quicker.

Spellings

Spellings continue to be given out each Monday and the spelling test will be on the following Monday. These will be related to a spelling pattern or rule that we have worked on.
